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PBIS Pardners

Kay Carl is pleased to introduce PBIS to our campus. Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a school-wide system that helps create positive environments by teaching and supporting appropriate student behaviors. PBIS is based on the idea that students learn best through instruction, practice, feedback, and encouragement. The program emphasizes four elements: data, measurable outcomes, evidence-based practices, and systems to support implementation.


Parents are an important part of PBIS implementation. Here are some ways parents can support PBIS at home:

- Use the same expectations: Use the same expectations that the school teaches at home to create consistency and support.
- Review expectations: Review the school's expectations with your child.
- Ask about the day: Ask your child about their day at school every day.
- Use positive reinforcement: Use positive reinforcement for appropriate behaviors.
- Use consequences: Use consequences for inappropriate behaviors.
- Consider daily use: Consider using PBIS at home daily, especially during events that disrupt normal routines.

Through the addition of PBIS, we have introduced school-wide core values to our students, and we are excited to share them with our school families as well. Our core values are **K**IND, **C**APABLE, **E**MPATHETIC, **R**ESPONSIBLE, and **S**AFE.

- Zipping and unzipping
- Buttoning and unbuttoning
- Washing hands on their own
- How to sneeze
- Appropriate bathroom behavior

Second grade teachers have been happy to welcome our new incoming 2nd grade students. We also want to welcome a new member to our teaching team, Mrs. Smith. Although Mrs. Smith is not new to our school, she taught 1st grade last year, she is new to our 2nd grade team and we are glad to have her join our team this year.

We have been busy getting to know our new students and teaching them the ropes of 2nd grade this past month. Beginning of the year testing has been completed and we are ready to get our students where they need to be for the rest of the school year.



Our students have been working on being able to identify story elements in reading: Beginning, Middle, and End of a story along with the setting, characters, problem, solution, and plot of a story. In phonics we have been

reviewing our long and short vowel spelling patterns. We have also been learning how to capitalize proper nouns and using the correct punctuation at the end of sentences. In math we have been reviewing and practicing strategies on how to add and subtract within 20.
